Cost

Enrichment classes cost \$260 for a full-day, week-long camp session or \$125 for a half-day, week-long camp session. This can be billed to your monthly invoice or paid directly to Bergman Academy. Checks should be made out to *Bergman Academy*.

Snacks and Lunch

- For those students attending full-day camps – you are responsible for one snack and lunch. Times to eat your snack and lunch will be included in the session. Your other snack will be provided by Bergman Academy.
- For those students attending half-day camps – snack will be provided.
- If you are attending two half-day camps (a morning and an afternoon session), you may enroll your child in Extended Lunch for \$10 a week, where they will be supervised from 11:45 a.m. – 12:15 p.m. You will need to provide a lunch for your child. Eating utensils, refrigerators, and microwaves will NOT be provided.

Enrollment

Minimum and maximum class enrollment numbers may apply to certain enrichments. Bergman Academy reserves the right to cancel any program due to lack of sufficient participation. Due to the registration format, there is a chance you'll be able to register for a club that has already met its maximum. If this is the case, you will receive an email within 24 hours letting you know that the club is full. If you don't receive an email, then your registration is complete. If the club you are trying to register for does not show up on the registration form, it is already full and no longer accepting members. **On April 1st, you will receive an email confirming all registrations.**

Cancellation Policy

Any cancellations made before March 29th will result in a full refund. Cancellations made on or after March 29th and before May 3rd will result in a 50% refund. Any cancellations made after May 3rd will not receive a refund.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up Policies

Please do not drop students off early for camps as there will not be adequate supervision. Please pick up your student at the designated camp location, at the appropriate time. If you are going to be more than five minutes late, please notify the instructor. You will be charged an additional \$10 per 15 minutes past the five-minute grace period. Late pick-up fees are due at the time of pick-up. Location information will be sent out in the confirmation email on April 1st.
