Cost

Enrichment classes cost \$125 for 8-week sessions, \$110 for 7-week sessions, and \$95 for 6-week sessions. This can be billed to your monthly invoice or paid directly to Bergman Academy. Snacks Students are encouraged to pack a healthy snack each afternoon. They'll have time between 3:30-3:45 pm to enjoy their snack.

Enrollment

Minimum and maximum class enrollment numbers may apply to certain enrichments. Bergman Academy reserves the right to cancel any program due to lack of sufficient participation. Due to the registration format, there is a chance you'll be able to register for a club that has already met its maximum. If this is the case, you will receive an email within 24 hours letting you know that the club is full. If you don't receive an email, then your registration is complete. If the club you are trying to register for does not show up on the registration form, it is already full and no longer accepting members. Confirmation emails will be sent on December 5th.

Pick-up Policy

Students will be dismissed at 4:45 pm out the front doors, to be picked up at the entrance of the school or in car line. Instructors remain with their students for 10 minutes after the club ends, and all students not picked up by then will then join the After Care program. A \$15.00 charge will be incurred.

Late Registration Policy

Registrations submitted after the stated registration deadline will be charged a fee of \$10 per enrichment club.

Cancellation Policy

Our instructors are extremely dedicated to the enrichment program at Bergman Academy. They spend a lot of time preparing and planning for their clubs. Due to their hard work and preparation, we will be enforcing a cancellation policy this year. Cancellations made 10 days or more in advance of the enrichment session start date, will receive a 100% refund. Cancellations made within 3-9 days will incur a \$50 fee. Cancellations made within 48 hours of the enrichment session start date will be charged full price.
